The Fullerton Hadley Landcare Group meets regularly at Kempton Hall on Fullerton Road, next to the Rural Fire Service shed. The group offers a relaxed & friendly way to meet your neighbours, learn new skills and gain knowledge on topics & issues that affect local landholders and community.

Recent Workshops & Events

- In the last four months, workshops have covered different issues including 'All about Pest
 Animals', a significant and ongoing problem in the area conducted by Mark McGaw from LHPA.
 The strong attendance (over 22 people) and consistent feedback from those who participated
 was feral animal control needs to be a community effort, conducted and co-ordinated between
 neighbours.
- Leading bird expert Tony Saunders presented an informative workshop, 'Birds on Farms' on how
 to recognise and attract birds to your property that included visiting different habitat areas
 within the district. Numerous bird species were spotted during the walks and a practical session
 looked at mosaic tree planting strategies.
- 3. A visit was taken to John Weatherstone's property 'Lyndfield Park' near Gunning. Over 30 years, John has transformed and regenerated a drought prone, marginal farming operation by extensive native tree planting to create a sustainable and resilient farm, that's recognised both locally and internationally. The group learned about various planting techniques and the identification of different Eucalypt and Acacia species.
- 4. Well done to the 'Landcare Ladies' for their baking skills and to Martin & Robert for both supplying and cutting the timber for a wood raffle & cake stall held in Crookwell in late September. Over \$630 was raised and these funds will be used to promote future activities, events & workshops.

Future Funding – Kanangra Boyd to Wyangala Link

2014 is looking to be a very busy year for Fullerton Hadley Landcare Group. The Hadley locality has been included in the Kanangra Boyd to Wyangala Link, itself part of the wider Great Eastern Ranges Initiative. As part of the initiative, individual landholder grants in Hadley & surrounding areas are due to be available with a provisional release in January 2014. Our understanding is grants may be available with specific focus on invasive species eradication including serrated tussock, blackberry as well as feral animal control including on pigs, foxes, rabbits and goats.

Fire Update

Fire restrictions extend until 31/03/2014 with <u>NO</u> fires without a permit. To obtain a permit you must contact your local Brigade Captain. **During Total Fire Bans, NO fires are allowed under any circumstance.** Current bush fire alerts are updated via the RFS website or the 'fire- meter' on Fullerton Road in front of the fire shed.

Remember that the use of all machinery and equipment that has the potential to generate a spark or cause a grass or bush fire. This includes welders, angle grinders, lawn mowers, chainsaws, slashers and rotary mowers.

- Consider does the job really need to be undertaken, or it can be left to when it's safe?
- Do not use the above equipment on days of 'Very High' or above bush fire danger
- If you do use machines, use them during the morning while the fuel has some moisture
- It is recommended that at all times operators have dedicated fire preventive equipment with them
- Restrict the use of motorbikes to emergency use only and ensure there is no flammable material adjacent to the engine or exhaust system
- Remember to 'Turn Off 'electric fencing on days of "Very High" or above bush fire danger
